The theme, as well, commemorates the early immigrant religious sisters, who worked with the poor, sick and marginalized. It, indeed, is a recognition of those Italian and Italian American women over three centuries, who became "first" in every field imaginable, the first American saint; first female pilot of a major airline; winner of an Olympic gold medal; first woman publisher of a major magazine; an outstanding scholar; accomplished musician or artist; courageous community activist or first CEO of a major corporation.
